The workshop will be presented on:

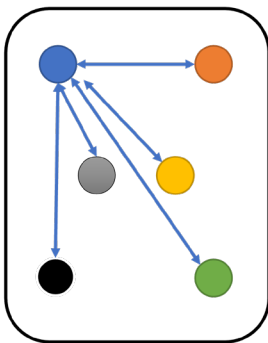

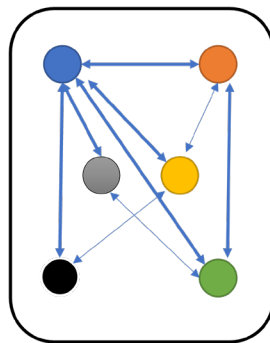


The workshop will cover topics building toward large/complex proposals and the practice of team science:

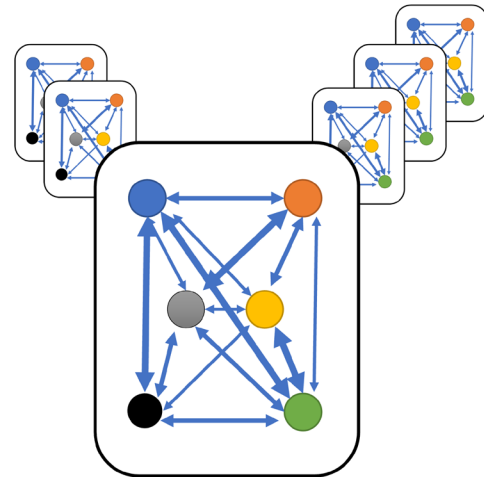
1. Transitioning from single- to multi-investigator proposals

3. Preparing to lead large/complex proposals



**Multi-investigator**  
Investigators link to the lead, not necessarily to each other



**"Small c" collaboration**  
Investigators have documented interaction and integration



**"Big C" Collaboration – Team Science**  
Investigators are highly cohesive and well-integrated; team extends beyond any single project
